#### JUNE-01

- World No Tobacco day was observed on 31st May every year. World Health Organization launched 'Stop illicit trade of tobacco products'. Uttarakhand health minister SS Negi is conferred with World No Tobacco Day Award.
- ♦ International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers was observed across the globe on 29th May, 2015 theme 'together for peace'.
- Finance Minister has inaugurated **New Bank note paper line unit in Hoshangabad**, **MP.** The project worth a total of 495 crore rupees.
- Gatimaan Express is the first semi high-speed train service that will be launched between Delhi and Agra. Train will run at a maximum speed of 160 kmph & is expected to cover the 200-km distance between both destinations in about 105 minutes. Commissioner of Railway Safety (CRS) has been not granted yet. After successful implementation of this semi high-speed train service between Delhi and Agra, Indian Railways is seeking to implement it on nine more routes. It includes Kanpur-Delhi, Hyderabad-Chennai, Goa-Mumbai, Nagpur-Bilaspur, Nagpur-Secunderabad and Chandigarh-Delhi.
- ♦ Former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee to be awarded Bangladesh Liberation Award. For his outstanding support for the country's independence from Pakistan in 1971 when he was a Lok Sabha member. Former Indian Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was the 1st to be honoured with award. President Pranab Mukherjee also has received this award in 2013.
- **SBI has launched online customer acquisition solution (OCAS)** by SBI chairman Arundhati Bhattacharya. It is an online platform to apply for Home Loans, car loans, Education Loans and personal loans.
- Advanced version of indigenous **Pinaka** mark-II rockets were successfully tested on 30 May 2015 in Pokhran field firing ranges in Rajasthan. They were test-fired using a multi-barrel rocket launcher **(MBRL).** In the test six rounds were successfully tested which had hit the target situated 53 kms from the firing point.
- President Pranab Mukherjee has given his assent to **re-promulgation** of land ordinance for third time as per provisions of **Article 123** of Indian Constitution.
- Punjab government has announced that year 2015-16 will be will be observed as development year to give further fillip to the all-round development of the state. It was announced by Chief Minister Parkash Singh Badal, in Dhuri Assembly segment of the state.
- Meena Hemchandra appointed as Executive Director of RBI replacing Chandana Sinha.
- Rear Admiral Philipose G Pynumootil took over as Assistant Chief of Naval staff (Air).
- Jyoti Prasad Rajkhowa is the 19th Governor of Arunachal Pradesh; Jyoti Prasad is a former IAS officer (1968 Batch) who served as Assam Chief Secretary.
- Veena Jain is appointed as the Director General of Doordarshan News.
- Super 30 founder and Mathematician Anand Kumar is honoured by legislature of British Columbia in Canada at Toronto University. Super 30 established in 2002 by Anand Kumar in Patna, Bihar provides free residential mentoring to 30 selected students from under privileged families to appear in the entrance exam of IIT-JEE.
- Researchers from **China** have successfully developed the first automated teller machine (ATM) with **facial recognition technology**. The machine has unique security feature which does not allow users to withdraw cash unless their face matches their facial ID. **ATM Machine** is created by **Isinghua University and Hanzhou based technology company Tzekwan**. Key facts The machine has a camera installed in which captures the facial features of the user and then compares it with photos stored in a database for authentication.
- 1st woman President of Mauritius is internationally -renowned scientist and biologist the Indian Ocean island nation is Ameenah Gurib-Fakim, she will succeed Former president Kailash Purryag.

- Opposition leader **Muhammadu Buhari** became the **5**<sup>th</sup> **President of Nigeria**. He won the president elections defeating **Goodluck Jonanthan**. Buhari is the leader of **All Progressive Congress Party**.
- Sania Mirza and Martina Hingis reached the quarterfinals of French Open in Women's doubles category.
- Joseph Sepp Blatter is re-elected as FIFA president for the 5<sup>th</sup> term. Sepp Blatter secured 133 votes out of 206 valid votes with the total of 209 members. By defeating his rival candidate Prince Ali bins Al Hussein of Jordan.
- ♦ Kolkata's Mohun Bagan Football Club (FC) has won the I-League title by defeating Bengaluru Football Club. Mohun Bagan won the title after a 1-1 draw score against Bengaluru FC in their final game of the 2014-15 season played at the Kanteerva Stadium, Bengaluru.
- Ace Indian shooter Gurpreet Singh has secured India a fifth quota place in shooting for the 2015 Rio Olympics.
- Ace Indian archer Deepika Kumari wins bronze at Antalya Archery World Cup.
- Dilawar Singh of Haryana has won 'Pedal for Kashmir' cycling competition, held along the banks of picturesque Dal Lake in Srinagar.

- ♦ A web portal (Khoya Paya) to be used as social medium for people to share information about missing children was launched by Union Government. Union Minister of Women and Child Development Maneka Gandhi and Union Minister of Communication & IT Ravi Shankar Prasad jointly launched the website.
- Board of Cricket in India has decided to make a cricket advisory committee for the uplift meant of Indian Cricket, BCCI has included 3 former players to the committee, Tendulkar, Sourav Ganguly and VVS Laxman.
- Two people have died of *Middle East Respiratory Syndrome* (MERS) in South Korea making it country's first fatalities from the disease. The *first victim was a 58-year-old woman who had contact with the original case, a South Korean* who visited the Middle East and second one is of a 71-year-old man. So far, 25 confirmed cases of MERS virus have detected in South Korea and around 680 people who might have come into contact with the infected patients, have been placed in isolation. *Facts about Middle East Respiratory Syndrome* (MERS) MERS belongs to the family of corona viruses which includes large family of viruses such as common cold and Severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS).
- India, Sweden ink six agreements during President Pranab Mukherjee's visit, he is the first ever Indian head of state to visit Sweden.
- P Kunhikrishnan is appointed as the director of Satish Dhawan Space Centre Shar. He succeeded MBS Prasad who passed away last month. SDSC SHAR is located near Sullurupeta on an Island in Nellore district of Andhra Pradesh.
- Hemant Sonawala, one of the pioneer founders of India's information technology (IT) industry passed away on 30 May 2015 in Mumbai, Maharashtra.
- Pawan Munjal was appointed as the Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) & CEO of Hero MotoCorp Ltd (HMCL). He succeeded his father Brijmohan Lall Munjal. Brijmohan Lall has been the Chairman of Hero MotoCorp since its inception in 1984.
- Amit Jain is appointed as the president of **Uber Technologies in India.** Uber Technologies is a US based Taxi hailing App.
- Edward Snowden Awarded Freedom of Expression Prize in Norway.

- Trail run of Kolkata-Dhaka-Agartala bus service began. Agartala from Kolkata will be reduced to 17 hours.
- India and Belarus signed **six** agreements to enhance **bilateral** co operation.
- Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has reduced the policy repo rate under the liquidity adjustment facility (LAF) by 25 basis points from **7.5 per** cent to **7.25 per cent** with immediate effect. It was announced in the second bi-monthly policy of RBI.
- Jaipur Metro Rail (JMRCL), was flagged off by chief minister Vasundhara Raje. This is the sixth state in India to have metro rail services. The metro rail will run between Mansarovar to Chandpole (9.6km) in its first phase with 9 stations. completed in record 4 ½ yrs making it one of the fastest-built rail metros in India with cost of 2,023 crore rupees
- **Maharashtra** government has approved a new **Renewable Energy Policy** which aims at achieving 14,400 MW of installed capacity over a period of five years i.e. till 2020.
- ♦ US President Barack Obama signed the **USA FREEDOM Act 2015** into law. With this, the **National Security Agency (NSA)** lost its authority to collect the phone records of millions of Americans.
- ♦ Union government launched a new web portal for exchanging information of *missing and found children*. The website was launched by *Ravi Shankar Prasad and Maneka Gandhi*, the union ministers. The website was jointly developed by *DeitY* and Union Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- ♦ Union Government has launched IAP Health Phone programme, world's largest digital mass education programme to address malnutrition in women and children. It was launched by Union Minister of Women and Child Development Maneka Gandhi in New Delhi. This programme was developed by the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) in partnership with the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, UNICEF and is supported by Vodafone India.
- India and United States (US) have signed a new strategically important 10-year defence framework agreement. The agreement was signed between Union Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar and visiting US Defence Secretary Dr. Ashton Carter in New Delhi.
- Pawan Munjal is appointed as the Chairman and Managing Director and CEO of Hero MotoCorp Ltd.
- *Meena Hemchandra* is appointed as the *Executive Director* of *RBI*.
- Ravi Shastri is Re-appointed Director of Indian Cricket Team.
- Punit Renjen, Chairman of Board of Deloitte US is appointed as the Chief executive officer of Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu Limited.
- **Edward Snowden,** former US security contractor and electronic surveillance whistleblower has been awarded a Norwegian prize for freedom of expression (also known as Bjornson Prize).

- ♦ The Delhi Metro received its first train which is capable of running without a driver Korea based manufacturer. The train will run with a speed of 85 kmph and the maximum speed is 95 kmph. The six-coach train has been manufactured at Changwan in South Korea and had arrived by sea at the Mundhra port in Gujarat and was brought to Delhi by road.
- State Government of **Delhi** Bans **Maggi** Noodles.
- Dr. Achyuta Samanta, founder of KIIT and KISS, has been conferred with the 'Isa Award for Service to Humanity 2015 in Bahrain. He received the award in the field of 'Social Welfare and Fighting against Poverty'.
- World Bank approves \$ 250 million loan for Jhelum and Tawi Flood Recovery Project in J&K.
- Maharashtra Govt has invoked stringent provisions of the Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime Act (MCOCA) against ration mafia.
- **Rafael Nadal**, the 9th time champion of French Open was knocked out of the tournament in the quarter final match. He was defeated by **Djokovic** who is going to play the semi-final match with Andy Murray.
- Former director of Intelligence Bureau, **Syed Asif Ibrahim** is appointed as the PM's special envoy on countering terrorism and extremism. He retired from intelligence bureau in December last year. **1977** batch of **Indian police service** officer of Madhya Pradesh cadre.
- Suresh Kalmadi was conferred with the president's award of Asian Athletic association for his contribution for development of athletics. The award was handed over to the president of Athletics Federation of India at a function held in China.
- India joined the Multilateral Competent Authority Agreement (**MCAA**) on Automatic Exchange of Financial Account Information (**AEOI**) in Paris, France, alongwith Australia, Canada, Costa Rica, Indonesia and New Zealand. Multilateral Competent Authority Agreement (MCAA) is an agreement which provides for establishment of an international platform that would allow exchange of information on an annual basis, including account balances.
- Eminent Indian umpire Sundaram Ravi, along with Chris Gaffaney of New Zealand, was inducted into the Emirates Elite Panel of ICC Umpires for 2015-16. Sundaram Ravi, 11-year long wait for an Indian umpire to make place in ICC's Elite Panel of Umpires.

- ♦ World Environment Day (WED) was observed across the world on 5 June. - India's *first rail coach lit by solar panels. Northern Railway* rolled out India's first rail coach lit by *solar panels*. Delhi division of northern railway rolled out non-ac coach lit by solar panels mounted on it's roof.
- Taj Mahal Ranked 3rd among World's Top Landmark, top 2 places were taken by Machu Picchu in Peru & Angkor Wat in Cambodia.
- Nestle withdrew its instant food Maggi from most of the Indian markets.'
- Union Government inks loan pact with **World Bank for Tamil Nadu Urbanisation Project**. The loan agreement, signed by Raj Kumar, Joint Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance and Onno Ruhl, Country director of World Bank (India).
- India has lost a **poultry case against United States** at World Trade Organization (WTO) after WTO's Dispute Settlement Board (DSB) ruled that India's ban on import of poultry meat, eggs and live pigs from US is inconsistent with the international norms. India had banned imports of various agriculture products including poultry meat and eggs from the US in 2007.

- **AB De Villiers** is conferred the South Africa Cricketer of the year 2015 award.
- Machettira Raju Poovamma and Liksy Joseph win silver medals in Asian Athletics Championship.
- Saina Nehwal Enters Indonesian Open Women's Singles Quarterfinals.

#### JUNE-06

- Andhra Pradesh chief minister N Chandrababu Naidu laid the foundation stone for new capital city Amaravathi, in Guntur district.
- The first green police station in India is inaugurated in Maruthi (Maurice) Nagar in North Delhi. The police station has roof coated with slaked lime to keep it naturally cool.
- India's second largest software services firm, *Infosys has appointed R Seshasayee* as non-executive chairman. Seshasayee replaces K V *Kamath* who stepped down to join BRICS Bank as its first president.
- ♦ Union Government launched nationwide Jal Kranti Abhiyan. It was launched by Union Minister of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejunivetion Uma Bharti in Jaipur, Rajasthan. Jal Kranti Abhiyan aims at turning one water scared village in each district of the country into water surplus village water through a holistic and integrated approach by adopting conservation and management techniques.
- Indian Medical Association(IMA)'s first Aushadhi medical store was inaugurated by Minister of State for Chemicals and Fertilizers Hansraj Gangaram Ahir at IP Estate IMA's headquarter in New Delhi. The store will offer over 118 commonly used drugs at a 10 to 20 percent lesser price than market value.
- ♦ Kotak Mahindra Bank and ING Bank have inked a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for exploring opportunities arising from cross-border business, investment and trade flows across various regions, including Europe. ING Bank holds 6.5 per cent stake in Kotak Mahindra Bank which is India's fourth largest private sector lender.
- UK author **Ali Smith** won 2015 bailey women's prize for fiction for her novel, "HOE TO BE BOTH".
- Aarti Agarwal, popular Telugu film actress died at the age of 31 years in New Jersey.
- Doctors from Texas State of United States *have done the world's first partial skull and scalp transplant from a human donor*. This rare medical feat which opens new frontier in transplant surgery was achieved by team of Doctors from Houston Methodist Hospital and MD Anderson Cancer Center. The recipient patient was Jim Boysen, a 55-year-old software developer who had suffered a large head wound from cancer treatment.
- ♦ Indian Wrestler **Prem Nath** passed away.

#### JUNE-07

- Kerala government is going to set up first elephant hospital in the state. This is the first of its kind in India. The hospital which is going to be set up with a cost of Rs. 10 crore will be set up on five acre plot in Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University.
- Two bus services that will connect West Bengal. Assam, Tripura and Meghalaya with Bangladesh capital Delhi were flagged off.
- ♦ Adani Power Limited (APL) and Reliance Power Limited of India have signed separate memorandums of understanding (MoUs) with Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB). These MoUs were signed on the first day of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Bangladesh.
- ♦ Former bureaucrat *Dr. Mahesh N. Buch* who was widely regarded as the *architect of modern Bhopal*, passed away following a brain stroke in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. He was 80. He was known for his clear views in context of urban planning and environment protection for betterment of Bhopal and Madhya Pradesh.
- ♦ Andhra Pradesh chief minister Chandrababu Naidu's audio tapes were released by Telangana government which are related to Note for Vote case in which *Revanth Reddy is also arrested*. The tapes contained the *voices of Stephenson* and other voice which is said to be the voice of AP Chief minister *Chandrababu Naidu*. The tapes were leaked when the Telangana government is celebrating the anniversary of Telangana formation.
- ♦ Lewis Hamilton (Britain) won the Canadian Formula 1 Grand Prix. This was fourth win for Hamilton this year and with the win he extended his lead in the F1 standings over fellow Mercedes teammate Nico Rosberg (Germany), who finished the race at second place. Valtteri Bottas was third. Ferrari's Kimi Raikkonen and Sebastien Vettel were fourth and fifth respectively.
- Stanislas Wawrinka of Switzerland won his 1st French Open Men's single title of Tennis. In the final match he defeated Novak Djokovic of Serbia. This was second grand slam title for Wawrinka after Australian Open 2014.
- Serena Williams of America won the French Open 2015 Women's Singles Title. This is her 20th Grand slam title. She defeated Czech Lucie Safarova in the final match of French open.
- Barcelona FC has won 2015 Union of European Football Associations (UEFA) Champions League trophy for the fifth time.
- India has slapped anti-dumping duty on imports of certain steel products from three South Asian countries viz China, Malaysia and South Korea. The anti-dumping duty was imposed by Union Finance Ministry on the recommendation of Directorate General of Anti-Dumping Duty (**DGAD**) to protect domestic producers from below-cost inbound shipments. The duties have been imposed for five years on imports of certain varieties of steel especially on hot-rolled flat products of stainless steel used in automobile sectors.

#### JUNE-08

- World Ocean Day was observed across the globe on 8th June 2015. World Ocean Day 2015 was observed with the theme, "HEALTHY OCEANS, HEALTHY PLANET". World Ocean Day was introduced in 1992 at RIO DI JANERIO with a motive of raising awareness of people towards the crucial role that SEA plays in our lives.
- Union Environment Minister Prakash Javadekar on 8 June cleared the Coastal Road Project of Mumbai, Maharashtra. This 12000-crore project will cover 35.6 km between Nariman Point & Kandivali, along the western seafront. Project will begin in mid-August 2015.
- India and Bangladesh have signed land boundary agreement 1974. According to the agreement, India received 51 enclaves out of a total of 111 enclaves which Bangladesh had took over. India and Bangladesh have signed 22 bilateral documents.
- India, Netherlands sign MoU for development of Measles- Rubella Vaccines.

- The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) is a nodal statutory agency responsible for protecting and promoting public health in India through the regulation and supervision of food safety. FSSAI was established under the Food Safety and Standards Act. 2006 and operates under aegis of Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. Functions: FSSAI has been established to lay down science based standards for various food products in order ensure availability of safe and wholesome food for human consumption. It also regulates the manufacture, storage, distribution, sale and import of food products for human consumption.
- Dasaradhi Rangacharya, the Legendary Telugu writer passed away in Hyderabad. His novels Chillara Devullu (The Lesser Deities)-1969. Moduga Poolu (Fire Flowers)-1971 are well known for influencing Telugu people against oppression by the rulers.
- Team India is going to play one test and three one day international matches in Bangladesh. The team is led by Virat Kohli.
- 11 Indo-Canadians are honored with ICCC annual awards 2015. Awards were presented by Toronto mayor JOHN TORY and president of the Indo-Canada chambers of commerce(ICCC) D P JAIN at the annual gala award ceremony held at Toronto.
- RC Taval Appointed as new DG of National Security Guard.
- Former Chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes, K.V. Chowdary appointed as the new Central Vigilance Commissioner (CVC), while the senior-most Information Commissioner, Vijai Sharma, is the new Chief Information Commissioner (CIC). K.V. Chowdary is a former Chairman of the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT). He retired as CBDT chief in October last year and since then has been working as adviser to Supreme Court appointed Special Investigation Team (SIT) that is probing black money cases. Vijai Sharma, a former Environment Secretary, working as Information Commissioner in the Central Information Commissioner since 2012.

After its formation the cyclonic storm has moved north westwards.

- ♦ Bibek Debroy Committee on the restructuring of Indian Railways has submitted its final report to the Union Ministry of Railways. The committee has suggested measures for restructuring the Railway Board and its departments so that policy making is separated from day-to-day operations. Recommendations of Bibek Debroy committee Establishment of an independent regulator Railway Regulatory Authority of India (RRAI) with a separate budget and to be independent of the Ministry. It was seven-member panel headed by eminent economist and NITI Aayog member Bibek Debroy. The other 6 members are former cabinet secretary K M Chandrasekhar, Gusharan Das, Ravi Narain, Partha Mukhopadhyay, Rajendra Kashyap, Ajay Tyagi and Ajay Narayan Jha.
- ♦ Union Government has launched an *Indian Nuclear Insurance Pool (INIP)* of 1,500 crore rupees as per the mandatory provision under the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act (CLND), 2010. It was announced by Minister of **State (MoS)** in the **Department of Atomic Energy Jitendra Singh** in New Delhi. *INIP has become the 27<sup>th</sup> Insurance pool in the world*.
- Andhra Pradesh government launched digital depository of land record named as '*Mee Bhoomi*'. Mee Bhoomi lists the details of the lands such as owners, assessments, soil type, liabilities and crops grown.
- **BSNL** will launch free roaming that will allow BSNL customers to receive incoming calls at no calls across the country.
- Sai Kiran Goud from Hyderabad is said to be killed in Miami, Florida. The 21 year old is suspected to be killed by robbers when he refused to give away his iPhone.
- International Criminal Court called to arrest Sudan President Omar al-Bashir. Bashir is wanted in alleged war crimes and also crimes against humanity during Darfur Conflict in 2003. He reportedly arrived in Johannesburg and the court called for South Africa to arrest him.
- Philae comet lander has taken on the surface of Comet 67P (Churyumov-Gerasimenko) from seven-month hibernation. It was announced by European Space Agency (ESA) after the comet lander managed to communicate with Earth for more than a minute. In November 2014, Philae comet lander had created space history by becoming first to probe landed on a comet. The historic feat was achieved after it was dropped on to the surface of Comet 67P by its mothership Rosetta. After successfully landing on the comet it had worked for 60 hours and had conducted experiments and transmitted that data to Earth before going into hibernation after its solar-powered battery ran flat.

- ▶ Indian Railways on 15 June rechristened train No 19031/19032 Ahmedabad (Gujarat) -Haridwar (Uttarakhand) Mail Express also known as 'Haridwar Mail' as Yoga Express. 1208 km distance in 26 hours 05 mins. The train has number 19031 from Ahmedabad to Haridwar and number 19032 in the reverse direction. Its average speed is below 55 km/hr.
- Suvidha trains are going to run in peak seasons like festivals and other special occasions. The decision was taken by Railway Ministry. There will be no waiting list and only RAC tickets will be issued. No discounts will be offered to the customers. Advance reservation period is minimum 10 days and the maximum is 30 days. Irrespective of the age, all passengers will be charged full adult fare.
- ♦ Union government of India launched a website to connect job seekers and employers. The website was launched the digital employment exchange for Industries (EEX) portal by Union minister for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Kalraj Mishra. The website www.eex.dcmsme.gov.in allows job seekers to register their names in the site.
- Supreme Court has cancelled the All India Pre-Medical Test (**AIMPT**) 2015 and directed the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to re-conduct the test within one month. This verdict was given by a SC bench of Justice RK Agarwal and Justice Amitava Roy on a complaint filed by candidates.
- World Bank and World Health Organisation (**WHO**) in their latest report have reported that around 400-million people worldwide lack access to essential health services. About Charles Correa Charles Correa was born on 1 September 1930 in Secunderabad, Telangana. His famous Works: Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Museum at the Sabarmati Ashram in Ahmedabad (1958−1963), Madhya Pradesh Legislative Assembly in Bhopal (1967), National Crafts Museum, New Delhi (1975−1990), Bharat Bhavan, Bhopal (1982), Jawahar Kala Kendra (Jawahar Arts Centre), in Jaipur, Rajasthan (1986−1992), British Council, Delhi (1987−92), McGovern Institute for Brain Research at MIT, Boston (2000−2005), City Centre (Salt Lake City) in Kolkata, Champalimaud Centre for The Unknown in Lisbon, Portugal (2007−2010). He was Chief Architect for Navi Mumbai along with Shirish Patel and Pravina Mehta from 1970−75. He also had served as first Chairman of the National Commission on Urbanization and was appointed by then Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in 1985. He is founder of Mumbai's Urban Design Research Institute (established in 1984) dedicated to protect the environment and improve lives of urban communities. Awards and Honours: He had been awarded the Padma Shri (1972), Padma Vibhushan (2006) by Government of India. He was also awarded Royal Gold Medal for Architecture (1984) by the Royal Institute of British Architects, 7™ AgaKhan Award for Architecture (1998), Praemium Imperiale of Japan

- ♦ About Magna Carta Magna Carta is a Latin word which in English means Great Charter. It is most important document of England signed on 15 June 1215 at Runnymede alongside the River Thames in the English county of Surrey. It had originated as a peace and truce treaty between King John and a group of rebellious barons within his kingdom. The document had written promises between King John and his subjects mentioning that the king will govern England and deal with its people according to the customs of feudal law. Magna Carta had laid the first steps towards parliamentary democracy and the principle supremacy of law i.e. no one is above the law. It also laid the principle of balance of power between the governed and government.
- Tokyo based online recipe network Cookpad has acquired India's Cucumbertown, a Bengaluru-based social network for cooks and chefs for an undisclosed amount. After this acquisition Cucumber town will remain independent subsidiary under Cookpad. - ♦ Election Commission of India has **suspended Recognition of National People's Party (NPP)**. NPP is a state party in Meghalaya headed by former **Lok Sabha Speaker P.A. Sangma**. The decision was taken in lieu of its failure in filing the election expenditure statement related to 2014 Lok Sabha General Elections within the prescribed limit of 90 days.
- The world's 1<sup>ST</sup> Electric passenger aircraft named BX1E was manufactured in China. The BX1E has a 14.5-meter wingspan and a maximum payload of 230 kgs. It can fly at an altitude of 3,000 meters. The charging is completed within two hours, allowing a flight time of 45 minutes to one hour, at a maximum speed of 160 km per hour. The plane was designed by Shenyang Aerospace University and Liaoning general aviation academy in the northeastern Liaoning Province.
- Union Government has decided to increase from 100 days to 150 days the number of work days under MGNREGA in drought hit areas.
- Advertising Standard Council of India (**ASCI**) has launched ASCI online, a mobile application in a bid to address misleading advertisements. The application will provide consumers/users platform to report complaint services for misleading advertisements on a mobile apart from ASCI's online complaint facility. **It is India's first consumer complaint mobile app**.
- State Bank of India (**SBI**), the country's largest bank, has launched SBI **eforex**, an Internet-based platform that enables customers to book their foreign exchange transactions online.
- ♦ HDFC Launches Paperless Mortgage Plan. Country's 2<sup>ND</sup> largest private sector lender, HDFC Bank launched a 10-second paperless instant loan Scheme for its existing customers. The 10-second loan Scheme was launched as part of HDFC Bank's digital banking platform GoDigital. With this, HDFC bank became first banking institution to completely automate the entire process of loan approval and disbursement.
- ♦ The Chinese Version of the sacred ancient Indian scripture Bhagavad Gita was launched in China during an international yoga conference. The book was released by Indian Ambassador to China Ashok K. Kantha. This is the first a well-known Hindu ancient religious text was published in China. It was translated in Chinese by Professor Wang Zhu Cheng and Ling Hai of Zhejiang University in Shanghai and was published by Sichuan People's Publications. Foreword to the book was written by Nagaraju Naidu.
- Indian origin Keith Vaz, who is the longest serving MP in UK parliament is re-elected as the chairman of Parliaments Home Affairs select Committee.
- Haryana Government has launched a Village Mentoring Project (VMP) in a bid to improve healthcare and education of the villagers with a special emphasis on girl child. The project was launched in Rajjipur village of Panchkula district of state in collaboration with Indian School of Business (ISB). VMP is the first of its kind initiative in Haryana under which villages in the state would be mentored by leading educational institutions, corporate houses and other organizations. It will be launched in a phased manner in 5 villages each of the 22 districts in the state.

- ISRO's GAGAN To Provide Navigational Support To Railways. ISRO has announced to provide navigational support to Indian Railways through GPS Aided Geo Augmented Navigation (GAGAN) system. GAGAN was jointly developed by the ISRO and Airports Authority of India (AAI) with a view to assist aircraft in accurate landing. The GAGAN signal is being broadcast through two Geostationary Earth Orbit (GEO) satellites GSAT8 and GSAT10. The system was launched in 2011 as a payload with GSAT-8. With this launch India had joined the club elite nations comprising of US, Europe and Japan who have the same level of space-based augmentation for navigational purpose.
- Historian-author *Ramachandra Guha* has been selected for *Japan's prestigious Fukuoka Prize 2015* in the Academic category. Apart from him Thant Myint-U (Grand Prize category) and Minh Hanh (Arts and Culture category) were also chosen for this edition of award. - The Sri Lankan President, *Maithripala Sirisena*, has dissolved his country's Parliament, 160 days after assuming office in January 2015.
- 1st President of **New Development Bank**, (BRICS Bank) K V Kamath revealed that the operations of bank are expected to begin on April 15.
- UNCTAD- United Nations Conference on Trade and Development. released World Investment Report 2015. The report was titled as, 'Reforming International Investment Governance'.
- ♦ BHEL commissioned first 250 MW unit of *NTPC's Bongaigaon Thermal Power* Project of NTPC in *Assam*. BHEL is executing the NTPC's project for setting up three units of 250 MW each as coal- based project which will be completed by 2016.

- Indian Tennis Player Leander Paes joined the 100 partners club on ATP circuit. He is the 47<sup>TH</sup> player in the world to play with 100 different partners. He is going to pair with Marcel Granollers of Spain.
- **Andhra Pradesh** government has decided to form a Cabinet sub-committee named as **Krishi Cabinet**. This sub-committee will focus on the challenges of the Primary Sector Mission of state government undertaken to make agriculture and its allied activities profitable and sustainable for all-round improvement of the rural economy.
- Himachal Pradesh High Court has ruled that the daughters in tribal areas in the state shall inherit the property in accordance with Hindu Succession Act, 1956. This landmark judgment will help to bring a new resolution in the tribal society's in oder to grant equal rights to the girls and bring down gender disparity. The ruling was given by Justice Rajiv Sharma by upholding the earlier order passed by District Judge of Chamba in 2002 to grant legal rights to women in family property.
- **Sachin Tendulkar**, who retired from international cricket in 2013 after playing his 200th Test, has been voted the 'Best Test player' of the 21st century in an online poll. Sachin Tendulkar got 23% votes and was followed by Srilanka's Kumar Sangakara (14% votes) and Australia's Adam Gilchrist(13% votes).

- India has become most attractive investment destination in world after it was ranked first among 110 countries in a ranking of destinations for attractiveness to foreign investors. The ranking was based on baseline profitability index (BPI) 2015. In this edition of China was placed at the 65th position and US was placed at the 50th.
- Bihar, Tamil Nadu and Rajasthan to Supply Free Mil in Mid Day Meal.
- ♦ Andhra Pradesh Mining Development Corporation Signed MoU with NSL Mining Resources India. *India is fourth largest carbon emitter* in the world in terms of per capita emission accounting for 6.6 % of global emissions for the year 2012. It was revealed by the World Resources Institute (WRI) in its latest analyses of the country-wise carbon emissions of climate-damaging greenhouse gases (GHGs). According to the analysis figures of WRI, Top 10 emitters are: China (25.26%), US (14.4%), European Union (10.16%), India (6.69%), Russia (5.36%), Japan (3.11%), Brazil (2.34%), Indonesia (1.76%), Mexico (1.67%) and Iran (1.65%).
- Indigenously developed Light Combat Helicopter (LCH) prototype has been successfully cleared hot weather trials at Jodhpur, Rajasthan.
- ♦ The 28<sup>TH</sup> **Moorthidevi Award for 2014 is awarded to Vyomkesh Darvesh**, written by Vishwanath Tripathi. Vyomkesh Darvesh is the fictional biography of Hazariprasad Dwivedi, noted Hindi critic.
- A medical team in **Sharjah's Al Qasimi Hospital** successfully completed a pioneering surgery implanting a left ventricular assist device **(LVAD)** on a 21-year-old **Emirati** patient. The surgery is the first-of-its-kind in the United Arab Emirates (UAE).
- ♦ A team of scientists led by *Indian-American Debashis Chanda* from University of Central Florida (*UCF*) developed a nature-inspired technique for creating the world's *first full-colour*, *flexible thin-film reflective display*. This technology can help you switch your dress colour to a different colour in the blink of an eye, if someone at a wedding reception is wearing the same dress as yours.
- Ujjwal Batria has been appointed as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of French cement maker Lafarge's India operations.

- According to research published by the World Economic Forum (WEF), Indian Railways is the 8<sup>th</sup> largest employer in the world with 1.4 employees. It is followed by the Indian armed forces which employs 1.3 million people. The research shows that the world's biggest employer is the U.S. Department of Defense with 3.2 million employees, followed by People's Liberation Army (the Chinese military) with 2.3 million.
- ♦ Basketball Player born in India, **Satnam Singh Bharmara** is chosen by Dallas Mavericks Team as the 52<sup>ND</sup> pick. He became the **first Indian born player to be drafted by NBA** team.
- United Nations To Release \$ 25 million Fund For Relief Efforts In Yemen.
- Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL)'s indigenously designed & developed LCH attained a milestone by successfully completing the hot weather flight trials. (*LCH*) Light Combat Helicopter prototype, TD-3 was ferried from Bengaluru to Jodhpur for the trials.
- Indian pair of Jwala Gutta and Ashwni Ponappa won the women's doubles of Canada Open Badminton tournament 2015.
- Space X Falcon-9 rocket broke apart in flames minutes after lifting off from Cape Canaveral. The accident occurred in only two and half minutes after the launch. This incident is the third failure to send supplies to the ISS (International Space Station) in the last 8 months.

- ▶ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa flagged off the Chennai Metro Rail services through video conferencing from the state secretariat. The first phase of Metro service covers the 10-km overhead (elevated) stretch. It connects Alandur in south Chennai to Koyabedu in the north. The metro service will bear capacity of 1276 passengers with four coaches. It will cover seven stations in the stretch. They are Koyambedu, Arumbakkam, Vadapalani, Chennai Mofussil Bus Terminus, Ashok Nagar, Ekkattuthangal. Five stations and will stop for 30 seconds in each station.
- **Varttavali** is the name of the **new Sanskrit News** program launched by **Doordarshan**. Varttavali is a weekly program and will focus on news, features and discussions on events around the world and will be conducted in Sanskrit

- Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi expressed concern over the declining sex ratio in the country. He was on Mann Ki Baat programme on radio. He mentioned the Beti Bachao, Beti Padao schema and also other three social security schemes introduced by the government.

The team had used specialised software to register images in order to selectively integrate datasets and produce an accurate anatomic model of the heart. This study is considered as a huge leap for individualised medicine in the medical field of cardiology and congenital heart disease.
